Multimedia presentations use a combination of media to pass on information. In so doing it is recognised that different people learn in different ways and that the same information presented in a number of ways is learned more effectively. Multimedia elements include text, hypertext, sound, graphics, animation and video. Many presentations also include an interactive component as well.



For a computer system to be a real multimedia system it must be well equipped. There is not much point in attempting multimedia on a 64k 8bit computer. While you can work with some limited elements such as a slideshow, you cannot sample the full range of elements.

An effective multimedia workstation requires lots of RAM, a fast processor and a fast CD drive. In recent years CD speeds have increased from single speed to, in excess of 16 times faster than CD player speed.

Presenters of information are always looking for better ways to "serve up" information so that the receiver obtains the information in a more meaningful way. Multimedia achieves this through interactivity. This means that the person seeking information can control when, where and how often they view the information.
